Sustainability? While I was looking for Multi Exposure shots as a photographic challenge I decided on this combination. The message I had in my mind was that we are all part of Nature and not in control of it as we think we are.

Botanic gardens, parks are very important places in towns and cities for retreat from busy lives, contemplation, and first-hand experience of nature. About 90% of New Zealanders live in towns and cities, and not all of them can get out into the country to immerse themselves in the colour, sound and smell of nature and to experience the seasonal pulses. I have taken many photographs in Dunedin Botanic Garden over the years and see many other shutterbugs snapping away whenever I visit.

Gardens like that in Dunedin also offer an opportunity for volunteers to give back to nature and their community. This act of giving back is important for many people's sense of wellbeing and to maintain a sense of purpose in an increasingly fast world. Surveys have shown that support for environment is strongest in children and teenagers and amongst older (60 years and over) people. Many conservation organisations are powered by retirees who in turn are nourished by having the opportunity to educate and care for plants and animals.
