Description: Waveforms at Gentle Annie Beach on the West Coast, Te Tai o Poutini

Where and when: Mokihinui, Te Waipounamu, South Island, 17 Dec 2018

The Story: Waves build up and break down shorelines. They transport stone and sand to and from beaches and carve structures along the shore. The largest waves form when the wind is very strong, blows steadily for a long time, and over a long distance. Waves breaking on stony beaches have a raw and elemental beauty, and for me no tropical beach can rival the beauty of the rugged coastal landscapes found on the west coast of Te Waipounamu.
